


FY24 Annual Activity Report

Overview: In FY24 Chapters and Councils Reported:

- 630,931 volunteer hours. (11 percent growth over last year)
 - Total volunteer hours valued at \$20,063,606, using the Independent Sector's value of vol. time at \$31.80/ hour.
 - The equivalent of 303 full time employees.
- 3,217 conservation or science/monitoring projects involving 17,471 volunteers.
 (5 percent growth over last year)
- 3,185 youth activities that engaged 106,972 young people.
 (2 percent growth over last year)
- 4,624 other general community engagement activities reached 112,318 attendees.
 (7 percent growth over last year)


Volunteer Hours FY 1998 - 2024






FY24 Volunteer Hours Breakdown




* 2019/2020 was our fiscal year change, so volunteers reported for an 18 month period -- the last bit of which was the beginning of COVID-19.







The resources in the Leaders Only Tools section of tu.org are comprehensive and easy to use.



The Volunteer Leaders Forum (and the associated e-mail digest) is a helpful resource to stay connected with and learn from other TU volunteer leaders.








Which (if any) orientation, training or support did you receive when you first joined as a TU volunteer leader? (Check all that apply.)




















